SOUTHWEST

SWHRA will continue Job Access/Reverse Commute service for our customers without service interruption, projects and expenses eligible for JARC funding must relate to the development and maintenance of transportation services designed to transport welfare recipients and eligible low-income individuals to and from jobs and activities related to their employment. late-night and weekend service, guaranteed ride home service, shuttle service, expanding fixed-route transit routes, demand response van service, ridesharing and carpooling activities, bicycling, local car loan programs, and promotion and marketing.

SOUTHEAST TENN

The project activities will assist the low-income residents in obtaining employment after receiving transportation. Will employ one paid staff (JARC Director). Current regular transportation services in the rural counties are available Monday through Friday 6:00 am to 6:00 pm. Riders may access transportation by scheduling with the local SETHRA office

48 hours in advance. To access JARC benefits clients will contact the JARC Director to complete the appropriate application.

UPPER CUMBERLAND

The JARC program will provide transportation to low income; persons with disabilities and Families First recipients to and from employment and activities will be supporting and creating livable communities. The funds will be used for job training and local day care centers.
Serving Cannon, Clay, Cumberland, DeKalb, Fentress, Jackson, Macon, Overton, Pickett, Putnam, Smith, Van Buren, Warren and White Counties.

SOUTH CENTRAL DD

The JARC program will provide transportation to low-income workers, employment and childcare transportation. Communications and new partnerships SCTDD will develop a regional coordination plan and apply for grant funding in continuation of the current program.
Serving Bedford, Coffee, Franklin, Giles, Hickman, Lawrence, Lewis, Lincoln, Marshall, Maury, Moore, Perry and Wayne Counties.

CLEVELAND

The JARC program will provide transportation to low income; employ one paid staff (JARC Director). Transportation services in Cleveland are available Monday through Friday 6:00 am to 7:00 pm. Funding will be utilized to continue client ridership and program administration. Funding from 5316 Small Urban will pay 25% program administration costs. The remaining 75% will be equally distributed to other programming.

JACKSON

JTA's current service hours are from 6:00am to 10:30pm Monday through Saturday. JTA is proposing to continue its expanded hours of service, Monday through Saturday. This allows all persons, especially disabled, older adults and low income individuals on split shifts and later shifts to be able to travel to and from work, at the same time providing many more employment opportunities.

JOHNSON CITY

Access service will continue to serve the entire corporate limits of the City of Johnson City. For Residents below the federal poverty level within Johnson City Johnson City Transit (JCT) provides a variety of public transportation services to the residents of the Johnson City area, including fixed route, service university circulator service paratransit demand-response service, Job Access transportation service, supplying demand-response job-related trips to welfare recipients, low income individuals, and disabled individuals within the entire corporate limits of Johnson City.
